



- A. **Centennial Star**--The Whitman Centennial Committee commissioned this quilt in remembrance of their town's celebration in July 2012.
- B. **Star of the East**-- The Daws' farm is a 4th generation family farm. This quilt was inspired by Sylvia's sister, and is in honor of a dear friend who passed away from cancer. The colors used were her favorite. (The quilt is on the east side of the road.)
- C. **Hour Glass**--The Narum farm has been in their family for 70 years. They purchased the pole barn from a neighbor in 1979. Its original function was to house cattle. Today, it houses "cats" and is used for storage.
- D. **Swiss Star**--The quilt pattern exhibits the flag of Switzerland. It honors the owner's long lasting Swiss friendships.
- E. **Colonial Pattern**--The Ellertson's quilt is a colorful addition to their farmstead.
- F. **Cancer Ribbon**--This quilt is in honor of Jeff Anderson, who lost his life to breast cancer. The spring and summer greens used represent Jeff's love of camping and fishing with his sons. The star is in memory of the star gazing the family enjoyed while sitting around bonfires.
- G. **Laurel's Wreath**--The Vasicheks have lived in their home for 29 years. The house was built in 1963 for the Warren Snyder family. The quilt pattern was chosen for its simplicity.
- H. **Quilted Plum Typepad**--The Skjervem farm has been in the family since 1973. The quilt hangs on the south side of their pole barn. It can viewed from Highway 2.
- I. **Air Castle**--Nettiques, an antique store, has been in business for 6 years. The building was the former home of Adamson Lumber and Hardware Store. The quilt features retro and vintage-inspired colors.
- J. **My Stained Glass**--This quilt was patterned after a stained glass piece that hangs in the Narum's dining room. The farm has been in their family since 1911. The barn was built in 1945. Its original function was for dairy and beef cattle. Today it is used for storage.
- K. **Modified Mariner's Compass Star**--Iver and Lena Kjorsvik purchased this farm in 1905. Today, Scott and Melissa (Kjorsvik) Moen farm the land. The quilt is hung on a granary that was built in the 1960's. The granary is currently used for storage.
- L. **Our Country**--The Slettebak family has lived on their farm for 15 years. The quilt hangs on their pole shed.
- M. **Wild Rose**--Sylvia K. Daws chose the pattern and painted this quilt. The Wild Rose represents the beautiful pink prairie rose that brightens the landscape and the kitchen tables of Pioneer Women who picked them to cheer their humble homes.
